I really think the piece works better with just the tv figure, in fact I think the other guy detracts from the meaning of the piece, as I understand it. It's like he's there to state the obvious: he is a symbolic figure that could be anyone. Without him, the message still gets across- the viewer imagines a symbolic figure just like that one without having to be told. It would add a nice degree of ambiguity to the piece and call more attention to the part that is more interesting. But that is just my opinion. All I know is when you cover up the gunman, the scene becomes more vivid and captivating. When you cover up the tv man, you notice how poorly made the gunman is by comparison and how he really could not stand alone as his own sculpture.

Christian: you have a very naive view of art. Art is not always \*made\* for people to pick apart, but as soon as an artist displays it in public, that is exactly what it is for. This type of art is made to send a message, to make a statement. If you make art for yourself and never want it to be criticized, praised, interpreted, or misunderstood, you better keep it in your attic and never show another soul. You looked at a very strong statement and said, "it is wrong to react to this." That means you entirely missed the point of this piece that was made to inspire reaction.

Just because something qualifies as "art" does not mean it is good, and it doesn't matter how much time was spent on it. If you can create a work of art in an hour that is brilliant, it doesn't make it any less brilliant. If you create a mediocre work of art in ten years, it is still mediocre.
